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# **Saturday Club**

Saturday Clubs can be accessed by young people aged 10 to 17 years with additional needs or disabilities.

needs or disabilities.
Full support is provided to allow the young people to attend the club without their family carers.
This provides opportunities for them to spend time with their peers whilst their parents and siblings take a break from their usual caring responsibilities.
Young people can participate in



activities with the help of a one to one support worker where needed. The club allows young people to try new activities that would otherwise be difficult to access. Regular off-site activities into the community encourage integration, independence, confidence and the opportunity to practice important life skills. The club offers lots to do and take part in, such as swimming, bowling, arts and crafts, softplay, music and much much more.



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# **FUN Opportunity Play**

FUN Opportunity Play sessions are for children aged from birth to 5 years who have been diagnosed with an additional need or disability, or who have been referred to specialist services for assessment.

The aim of the group is to offer the children and their parents support, information and guidance at the very early stages of referral or diagnosis.

### **FUN Opportunity Play sessions offer families:**

- A safe and non-judgemental play environment for the child and their siblings
- Support and information from other families in similar circumstances
- Access to advice and information from visiting professionals such as therapists, nurses and health visitors to help parents with advice and support

FUN Opportunity Play sessions are held on Tuesdays 9.30am – 11.30am term time only. Refreshments available





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### **Keech Swim Sessions**

Swimming is a fantastic activity for children and young people with disabilities – and great fun for all the family!

FUN provides fortnightly swimming sessions at Keech Hospice in their adapted hydrotherapy swimming pool. Keech swimming pool is designed to cater for the needs of people with additional needs and disabilities of all ages. It has hoists, ramps and specially designed changing rooms.



The pool has water fountains, sensory lighting and a sound system. The water temperature is maintained at a higher level than public pools and the air temperature is controlled to avoid the "shiver" effect and coldness when getting out. There is also a six seated spa with soft lighting and fibre optics. Children must to accompanied by an adult.



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## **Holiday Club**

FUN holiday clubs run every school holiday offering children and young people with additional needs or disabilities, a safe and non-judgemental

environment to play, learn and interact with others. Full disabled changing facilities with overhead hoist and full sized changing table are available.

FUN offers a huge range of different activities onsite including:

- Sensory room (with overhead hoist)
- Music & media room
- · Computers and multi-media
- Table games pool/snooker table, air hockey, table football
- Separate play areas offering –
  Books & stories, Lego play, train/
  vehicle play, dressing up/theatre
  area, home corner, sensory play area,
  wildlife/soft animal area, arts & crafts



- Large activity hall offering ball pool, bouncy castle and much more
- Full disabled changing facilities with overhead hoist.
- Coffee shop/café

The Holiday Club is designed so that the whole family can attend together, including parents and siblings.

Sessions run from 10am – 4pm throughout the school holidays.



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### **Disability Awareness Training**

Families United Network offers Disability Awareness Training providing a general introduction to disability, with a strong emphasis on real life experiences and solutions. All of our training is delivered by parents of disabled children and young people who can offer first hand experience of what it is like to access education, health and other services whilst living with a disability; both from the perspective of the disabled person themselves and their family members and carers.

Training is for professionals and support staff working with young people living with additional needs or disabilities; employers and other public and private service providers.
